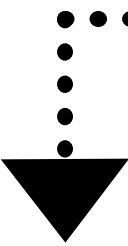

- Victim gets time and space to make informed decisions.
- Victim controls the release and management of personal information.
- Victim may develop increased trust in the "system".
- Victim decides when to report.
- Victim receives medical care, support and advocacy services.

Restricted Reporting Vs Unrestricted Reporting

Sexual Assault is a Crime!!

Unrestricted Reporting

Victim uses existing reporting channels to report sexual assault. Those channels are: Base Security, Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS), Command, Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC), Ombudsman, Medical, local law enforcement, Chaplain, or Clinical Counselor

Typical process that occurs:

▶ Victim offered information, support, victim advocacy, medical care, support group, counseling, and accompaniment to legal appointments..

▶ Command notification. Command safety actions, if warranted (e.g. Military Protection Order (MPO) or temporarily move victim or alleged offender).

▶ Law Enforcement notification/ investigation, if applicable.

▶ Local Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) can conduct a sexual assault forensic exam (SAFE).



Restricted Reporting

An active duty member or a military dependent that is 18 years or older may disclose abuse to certain individuals without command, law enforcement or a standard Sexual Assault case being opened. These individuals include:

- Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC)
- Unit SAPR Victim Advocate
- FFSC Clinical Counselors
- Civilian SAPR Victim Advocate
- Victim's Legal Counsel
- Navy Medicine: Healthcare provider is any person authorized to provide direct patient care in Medical or Dental.
- DoD Safe Helpline staff (will connect with SARC)
- Military Chaplain (will connect with SARC)

IMPORTANT TO NOTE

- If a sexual assault is disclosed to someone other than those authorized above, it will result in Command notification, law enforcement investigation, and a standard sexual assault case being opened.



Restricted Reporting Process

Active Duty member or a military dependent 18 years or older will be fully advised of the benefits and limitations of restricted reporting before electing a reporting option. If restricted is selected:

- ▶ The reporting selection will be noted on a Victim Reporting Preference Statement.
- ▶ Victim will be offered ongoing advocacy, support and medical care, both emotional and physical.
- ▶ Forensic medical evidence may be collected and stored up to 12 months.
- ▶ Victim may change to unrestricted reporting at any time.**
- ▶ Restricted cases are closed after 12 months.

**Once the decision is made to make a report unrestricted, it CANNOT be reversed. Restricted cases are
